

Bayard Cutting Arboretum was donated to the Long Island State Park Region by Mrs. William Bayard Cutting and her daughter, Mrs. Olivia James, in memory of her husband, William Bayard Cutting. The intent of the donation was "to provide an oasis of beauty and quiet for the pleasure, rest and refreshment of those who delight in outdoor beauty; and to bring about a greater appreciation and understanding of the value and importance of informal planting." Enjoy nature walks on trails throughout the 691 acres. Explore scenic woodlands and gardens. Choose to walk through the many trails; Paradise Island, Woodland Garden, Royce Rhododendron Garden, River Walk, New Pinetum Walk, Old Pinetum Walk, Paradise Island Walk, The Holly Walk, and the Perrenial Garden.





DIRECTIONS

From Nassau & Western Suffolk: Southern State Parkway EAST to exit 45E. Take Montauk Highway East for approxi-mately ¾ mile. Arboretum entrance will be on the right.

From Eastern Suffolk: Sunrise Highway WEST to exit 46. Take Connetquot Avenue South.Turn left onto Montauk Highway. Arboretum entrance will be on the right.

Student fee is \$7.00 per child. A non-refundable deposit of \$35 per class must be received via online registration or check in order to hold your reservation.

CHAPERONES

We recommend that two chaperones accompany each class. Teachers and chaperones will not be charged.

FIELD TRIP DURATION

Approximately 2 1/2 hrs. Fridays only.

Please Note: The majority of field trip activities are outside; therefore, if there is a threat of inclement weather, you will be contacted by the Education Coordinator. Trips canceled due to inclement weather will be completely canceled or rescheduled if there is availability.

GUIDED TOURS

Field Trips will include three tours on the grounds of the Arboretum. Children will tour through one of the many Arboretum trails, Westbrook Manor and the CSA Farm. All tours are presented by educators and experienced docents.







THE ARBORETUM

The students will enjoy a leisurely walk through the gardens making several stops along the way to learn about specific arboretum specimens.

WESTBROOK MANOR

The Manor house was designed in 1886 for William Bayard Cutting (1850-1912) by the architect Charles C. Haight in the Tudor style. Students will learn about the history of the mansion, the Cutting family and events of the times as they are guided around this magnificent manor house.

COMMUNITY-SUPPORTED AGRICULTURE (CSA) FARM

The CSA Farm is located on 14 acres of tillable soil, adjacent to the estate's original barn, on land that was the former cow pasture of the Bayard Cutting Estate. Students will tour the garden and chicken coop.
